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Agriculture Mechanics & Metal Technologies

Agricultural Mechanics and Metal Technologies is designed to develop an understanding of agricultural mechanics as it relates to safety and skills in tool operation, electrical wiring, plumbing, carpentry, fencing, concrete, and metal working techniques.

Certified Welding & Testing:

Students will work towards completing their American Welding Society (AWS) D1.1 and D9.1 welding certifications. They will be required to perform welding qualification test following the proper Welding Procedure Specifications (WPS) for each certification attempted.

Class participation grades will be based on the following scale:

Shop Safety Rules

1. **Always** wear appropriate eye protection anytime you are in the shop!
2. Know where all fire exits and fire extinguishers are, as well as where all first aid equipment is located.
3. Report any injuries to the teacher immediately.
4. Keep tools in good condition and report non-functional tools to teacher.
5. Be aware of your surroundings at all times. Watch for others before using tools & equipment.
6. Use the correct tool for each job. Do not use a tool improperly.
7. Keep safety guards in place on all tools.
8. Make sure all work is secured before using any tools on it or performing any work.
9. Once a tool has been used it is to be properly cleaned and put back in its place in the tool room.
10. Keep work area clean and picked up to prevent a potential trip hazard.
11. **Everybody will clean the shop at the end of each class to ensure the next group enters a clean and safe work environment!!!**
